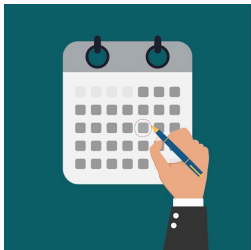

The leading legislation that is being considered in May is called, “Protocol” where 17 church leaders representing the broad diversity of the church agreed on a separation plan moving forward. Because of a personal connection in our church, Rev. Keith Boyette, who was one of the representatives in the room, will be here to speak to anyone interested. *Childcare will be provided.*



When I read the numerous stories of people Jesus encountered, I often wonder how they would apply to me. One such story is of a man named Legion told in Luke 8. When he saw Jesus, he shouted at the top of his voice, “What do you want with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God?” What most

remember about the story of Legion is that Jesus cast out the evil spirits living in him and sent the demons into 2,000 pigs. The pigs then rushed down a steep bank into the lake and were drowned. Quite a picture! Letter from the Pastor
March 6, 2020

"It's all about Jesus"

One of my favorite worship songs of all time repeats this phrase repeatedly, "I'm coming back to the heart of worship, and it's all about You, it's all about You, Jesus. I'm sorry, Lord, for the thing I made it, when it's all about You, all about You, Jesus." I don't know about you, but that's a reminder that I constantly need. We are searching the Scriptures on Sundays in the life of Long's Chapel to reflect on what God is trying to free us from, because it's not uncommon that we find ourselves eluding God's attempt to get His hands on us while we consume everything we can get our hands on. We grab for every false god we can find, and many times don't even think about the things in our life that we let "compete" with our loyalty to Jesus. So, I hope to see you on Sundays at 9:00, 10:10, or 11:11, as we continue to remove "junk" and "obstacles" from our life so that God's grace can truly reign in our life. God longs for us to be free, and "the truth shall set us free indeed."



I recently read a piece by Leonard Sweet which said, "The greatest heresy of the church today is the belief that it's the trees that move the wind. . . The notion that the most powerful forces in the world are physical, material, tangible, visible forces. It's not the trees that move the wind. It's the wind that moves the trees. 'Not by might, not by power (not even by programs, plans, processes, or politics) but by my Spirit, says the Lord' (Zechariah 4:6). Even trees like this one acknowledge the supremacy of the wind and the invisible because they bow and bend and buckle at the knees in homage to the wind."

When is the last time you thought about an image for the Christian life as being a tree dancing in the wind, allowing the wind to guide and direct you? Eventually (as we often see at the coast) when a tree bends long enough in the same direction of the wind, it begins to take the shape of that wind permanently.

This is an excellent image for those of us hoping to grow in God's grace. God's Spirit is blowing and moving in your life right now. When it's all about Jesus, it all fits into place, piece by piece.

Take heart, friends - for there is much work to do, but that work is towards a winning cause because Jesus Christ is Lord.

Long's Chapel Town Hall Summary Points - 3/3/2020

Chris welcomed about 75 people in attendance and Mike Rowe led in prayer.

1. Considering COVID19, encourage people to elbow bump/fist bump/use hand sanitizer when greeting – encourage live stream if one is feeling sick...on Wednesday nights with serving food, use gloves.
2. Cindy O = loves the new worship schedule.
Jim M. shared concern for when seasonal people return and capacity.
3. Judy P, asked about "real time" update on Open Door situation, noting press being "all over the place." Cindy O. shared that the family at the OD were very hurt by the recent article, discussed new director Bill Guy having also formed a Family Council so they are also involved in workings of OD and have a voice, and hold each other to high standards. Chris discussed still being in conversation with Asheville Buncombe Community Christian Ministry (ABCCCM), current situation being that dining services has to be out by June 10th (not 2nd Blessing store), Leadership team has asked OD ministry team to develop specific financial plan/costs for each option identified thus far, still exploring more. Dean M. Volunteers and supports the OD and talked that the ministry may be progressing to bigger need than just LCUMC can handle and it's ok to acknowledge that. Jennifer S. asked about what other churches have been asked to help. Cindy O noted that lots of other churches do help, discussed need for community to take more ownership as well.
4. Someone asked about upcoming church conference – Chris explained funds available through current endowment and now needing to vote on using those funds for the building, which would be congruent with the purpose of that endowment with unanimous support from Church Leadership (not the Long's fund).
5. Someone asked about the Christmas offering – Chris noted that just last week the total was calculated to \$23,700, and that this was just calculated due to gifts still rolling in until recently – and that there were designated and undesignated gifts that will support EACH, the HANGOUT, and some support for LC's Candidates for Ministry.
6. Jennifer S. noted that recently youth had to borrow a van, and questioned need for more transportation for youth. She wanted to make sure that the student ministry is a high priority for Long's Chapel. Chris indicated that typically the van and bus, which combined total nearly 40 seats is enough –but we can take another look at need to make sure we have adequate transportation for ministry groups.
7. Paul T. expressed being "very concerned" about the heading to a "cross roads in the UM church" – Chris acknowledged there is a "conflict on the horizon" – discussed the "Protocol for Grace" – discussed need for upcoming informational meetings prior to May General Conference – announced the March 29th informational session with Keith Boyette specifically about the Protocol. He was one of the authors of the Protocol legislation and has a relationship with George Freeman. Keith agreed to come discuss what the legislation says and what it was like to watch groups agree on a potential amicable separation. Jim M. noted that dis-affiliating would be very expensive and not our best option.

8. Torpy S. asked about the EACH program – Chris discussed currently serving three families, and the impact on those families has been being monumental.
9. Dean M. made suggestion that we use the bulletin to communicate more – discussed concern that many don't read the Trail Guide, The Chatter or the Leaf – and suggested even a monthly 'where we are at' sort of page giving updates on building/finances – how much we have – how much we need, possibly things about the Open Door, attendance. These comments were appreciated and received.
10. Ryan O. asked about progress towards finding a new modern worship leader and difference between PT/FT and posted salary. Chris indicated that it has been posted as a PT and FT job to see what interest we would get. Chris said he could get info but that that search was still ongoing. Jennifer S. showed appreciation to existing modern worship leadership team.
11. Jennifer listed out positives that she appreciates: 3 services, the 3 ministers, the behind the scenes staff (Caroline, Elizabeth), Judy/leadership team, and for Sally and Shawn working together for bringing Children's and Youth ministries together more.
12. Elizabeth M. announced that there is now sign up for the Easter Volunteers.

Concluded with five prayer groups praying simultaneously for different things discussed throughout the night. The Town Hall was concluded around 6:30pm.

(If you're unable to serve on your assigned week, please contact a member of the team to fill in or swap dates as needed.)

- ☐ After 11:11 service, get white basket from the Welcome Center cabinet.
- ☐ Make sure no candles are burning in the Sanctuary.
- ☐ Remove all trash, bulletins and any items left behind from pews.
- ☐ Make sure hymnals and Bibles are facing correct direction.
- ☐ Refill the pew pockets with 2 LC pens, connect cards and offering envelopes as needed. (Make sure pens are in the pen holes and not somewhere else.)
- ☐ Collect all unused bulletins from usher stations and rubber band together, place on Welcome Center counter in plastic bag (these are in the cabinet). These are for the office staff to count to ensure we are not overprinting.
